7. Guest presentation on Elderly Empowerment Network

- By Shirley Wright, General Manager – Christchurch Resettlement Services. Elderly Abuse & Empowerment. MSD funds – Age Concern & CRS. Isolation of elderly issues for ethnic community more so with language issues etc. CRS will offer knowledge to the community to deal with it better.

Immigration NZ relaxing visa for family (longer term), so potentially more issues in the community.

Lack of social network - Generation thing. Extended families live together but the new generation brought

up in NZ does not necessarily have the same idea as the older generation about taking care of elderly – potentially an issue in the future.

Community should take responsibility to support family. Migrants' family just visiting (visitors visa) are supported by CRS as well – same to Age Concern.

CRS have been working with migrants as NPO for some 30 years. It works with Refugees originally, now include migrants as its criteria. Generic support not only settlement issues.

Partnership / Collaboration – work together, better outcome – learn from each other.

Goal: support communities to address elder abuse

Office for Seniors (MSD) – funding CRS to offer support for own communities to look after elderly.

Partnerships:

CMC, CRS, Police, Council, Pura Pura Whetu*, Canterbury Family Violence Collaboration.

* First year support for refugees (2.5 years now) in Canterbury.

Currently finalizing the terms of reference and reviewing who CRS need to connect with and how to engage with diverse communities and older people.

Abuse: Things being forced against your own will (cultural background need to be aware)

Financial abuse, Not care given, Mental health, Family violence, Isolation.

Not one size fits all situations.

How can we get involved? Join network - Once every 6 weeks. Go out to communities and talk and offer support. We need to do this together.
